The chords on this page are all "7th<sup>th</sup> chords". That means in addition to the root, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> notes, they also have the "minor 7th" or "flatted 7th" note in them.

The flatted 7<sup>th</sup> produces less tension than the major 7<sup>th</sup> note so it can be used to generate tension that isn't as insistent about being resolved. These chords are used extensively in jazz and blues. It is also very common to see a 7<sup>th</sup> chord used in place of a major chord as the V chord in a progression.
